PROGRAM PATHWAYS:

ANIMAL & ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

Animal and Environmental Services programs are dedicated to the protection of nature and wildlife in the Charlottesville area. Students can participate in opportunities that are focused on environmental stewardship and sustainability by planting trees, restoring local parks and trails, or cultivating and maintaining community gardens. Additionally, students can help improve the welfare of local animals by volunteering at local shelters, horse stables, or a nearby animal sanctuaries.

EDUCATION & YOUTH SERVICES

50% of Madison House's programs are related to education and youth. We are in 20 schools across Albemarle County and Charlottesville City, and we partner with over 45 various non-profits who provide Education and Youth Services. Students engage with partners in varying capacities which include tutoring, child care, mentoring, and the arts.

HUMAN SERVICES

Human Services programs are dedicated to providing support to Charlottesville's emotional, psychological, and financial services and our most vulnerable communities. These communities include low-income families, people experiencing homelessness, and refugees. Among other opportunities, student volunteers may serve at food pantries, staff a local crisis helpline, form long-lasting relationships with elderly persons, assist in the construction and restoration of homes in the community, and even help local families file their yearly tax returns.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Madison House partners with the University of Virginia Health System and other local health care providers including Martha Jefferson and the Blue Ridge Health District, and volunteers will engage with partners in varying capacities. This can include assisting hospital staff with administrative duties, restocking supplies, as well as interacting directly with patients and addressing their needs.

Consistent service opportunities are for partners seeking a regular partnership with Madison House. Madison House will recruit volunteers to serve the partner on a predetermined schedule.
